Our school commitment

The Equality Act 2010 requires us to publish information that demonstrates that we have due regard for the need to:

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct prohibited by the Equality Act 2010.
- Advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and people who do not share it.
- Foster good relations between people who share a protected characteristic and people who do not share it.

At Forncett St. Peter Primary School we:

- Try to ensure that everyone is treated fairly and respectfully.
- Want to make sure that our school is a safe and secure place for everyone.
- Recognise that people have different needs, and we understand that treating people equally does not always involve treating them the same.
- Aim to make sure that no-one experiences less favourable treatment or discrimination because of:
 - Their age
 - A disability
 - Their ethnicity, colour or national origin
 - Their gender
 - Their gender identity (they have reassigned or plan to reassign their gender)
 - Their marital or civil partnership status
 - Their being pregnant or having recently had a baby
 - Their religion or belief
 - Their sexual identity and orientation.
- We recognise that some pupils need extra support to help them to achieve and be successful.
- We try to make sure that people from different groups are consulted and are involved in our decisions, especially pupils, parents, carers and those of us who can be treated less favourably.
- Our aim is for all children to achieve more.

Our school's vision and values embraces children's rights as detailed in the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC). These rights are at the heart of our planning, policies, practice and ethos. They are taught and modelled through strong positive relationships between pupils and adults, between adults and between



pupils. The school's ethos is built around the idea we should treat others as we wish to be treated.

We welcome our duties to:

- Promote British Values
- Eliminate discrimination, advance equality of opportunity and foster good relations (under the Equality Act 2010)

We also welcome the emphasis of Ofsted inspections on the importance of accelerating the progress of pupils from groups who are disadvantaged or underachieving.

As part of this we will:

- Publish information every year about our school population.
- Outline how we have due regard for equality and how we promote British Values.
- Publish equality objectives to show how we plan to tackle particular inequalities and improve what we do.
